Directions: Listed in the box below are nine activities that can be completed after reading a Picture Book Biography by David A. Adler. Read the activity choices and then decide which activities you will complete to get 3-in-a-row.

<p>Write a song about the person you learned about in the Picture Book Biography. You can make up your own tune or borrow a tune from a song you already know.</p>	<p>Assemble a costume to wear that represents the person you learned about in the Picture Book Biography. Greet and introduce yourself to at least three people.</p>	<p>Make a list of 5 questions about the person you learned about in the Picture Book Biography. Use these questions to make an online or paper poll to test the knowledge of friends and family.</p>
<p>Design a poster featuring the person you learned about while reading the Picture Book Biography. Think about including the person's name, a drawing, and a few important facts.</p>	<p>Compare and contrast your life to the life of the person you learned about in the Picture Book Biography. Draw two overlapping circles (Venn-Diagram) or make a chart to show your thoughts. Use pictures and words.</p>	<p>Create an award to present to the person you learned about in the Picture Book Biography for one of their notable accomplishments. Use a paper plate or a piece of paper to make your award.</p>
<p>Evaluate the accomplishments of the person you learned about in the Picture Book Biography. Make a list of three accomplishments that you think deserve to be noted.</p>	<p>The person you learned about in your Picture Book Biography had a struggle in their life or a problem to overcome. Write about this problem and how they were able to succeed. Then, write about a problem you have had in your life and how you succeeded.</p>	<p>Develop a visual that represents at least five important dates from the life of the person you learned about in the Picture Book Biography.</p> <p>The visual can be a timeline but is not limited to that format.</p>
